Welcome to Ottewell Junior High School!

We're thrilled to have you join our school community this fall. This letter contains essential information to help you prepare for the upcoming school year, including details about our 'Sneak-a-Peek' event, school supplies, bell schedule, and more. For current EPSB students, language and option selections can be completed through the student's SchoolZone account starting May 1st. Students new to EPSB will need to fill out the form (included) and either email or drop it off at the school. First Day of School

Mark your calendars! The first day of school is Thursday, August 29th, 2024. Homeroom lists will be posted in the front foyer. The first bell will ring at 8:16 a.m., signaling students to head to their homerooms. At 8:20 a.m., we officially kick off the day in period 1 with announcements. Teachers will then guide students through the necessary information and administrative tasks to start the new school year. The rest of the day will follow a modified schedule to help students acclimate to new routines, teachers, classmates, and the building. It's sure to be an exciting day! You'll find a copy of next year's Daily Bell Schedule included in this document for your reference.

Grade 7 'Sneak-A-Peek'

Join us on Tuesday, August 27th, 2024, from 10:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. for our annual Grade 7 "Sneak-A-Peek" event. During this time, Grade 7 students will have the opportunity to locate their homerooms, set up their lockers, navigate their timetables by moving from classroom to classroom, and meet their teachers in a relaxed setting, free from the hustle and bustle of busy hallways. It's an excellent chance to become familiar with the school before the official start of classes. While students explore Ottewell, parents are invited to join the school administration team in the gym for a "Welcome to Ottewell" session.

Transportation

Most Ottewell students commute to school via city buses known as 'School Specials' provided by Edmonton Transit. Bus passes can be purchased through SchoolZone or at the school before the morning bell and during lunchtime. Passes are available at the end of the preceding month and the beginning of each month. The current monthly bus pass rate is \$55, with rates for the 2024 - 2025 school year to be announced later. Edmonton Public Schools' Student Transportation collaborates closely with E.T.S. to ensure they have the necessary information about our students' neighbourhoods. E.T.S. monitors student ridership and adjusts as needed to meet student needs by implementing required school specials.

School Open and Closing

To ensure flexibility for our families with varying transportation needs, Ottewell Junior High School opens its doors to students at 7:30 am each morning. Additionally, students are welcome to remain on campus for as long as necessary after school hours. During this time, students are expected to stay in the hallway adjacent to the gymnasium. This arrangement provides a safe and supervised environment for students both before and after regular school hours.

School Supplies

Information regarding student supplies will be passed on in every class during the first few days of school. To prepare for the first day of classes, we ask that you purchase the basic supplies required for most classes.

(1) package of pencil crayons	(3) 3-ring binders - 2" - 3" size

It's essential for all students to have a combination lock for their lockers. These locks can be purchased at the school for \$8.50 each, and please note that key locks are not permitted. Before the school year begins, we strongly encourage students to review how to use the combination lock properly. Additionally, specific items such as calculators and geometry sets will be discussed during the first few days of school. Teachers will provide further details regarding these items and their usage.

Technology

At Ottewell School, we prioritize providing students with access to technology to enhance their learning experience. While students may opt to bring their own mobile technology such as Chromebooks or laptops to class, it's important to note that **smartphones and smartwatches are not permitted in the classroom and should be stored in lockers during class time**.

Dress Code

Our school adheres to Edmonton Public Schools' dress code policy, which promotes a welcoming, respectful, inclusive, safe, and healthy learning environment. We ensure that our dress code is fair, dignified, and non-discriminatory, respecting students' rights regardless of race, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, ethnicity, religion, cultural observance, socio-economic status, or body type. Student safety is paramount, and therefore, attire that poses a safety hazard is not permitted. Lanyards are also prohibited from being worn around students' necks.

Backpacks

To maintain an organized and safe learning environment in our classrooms and hallways, **students are not allowed to carry or bring backpacks to class**. Instead, they may use the string bag provided by the school.

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Availability and Enrollment:

- Please note that option courses are subject to availability depending on enrollment. Option classes with low enrollment may be cancelled.
- Not all option courses are offered at all times in our timetable, so students may not be able to take a certain class if it is not available during their preferred time slot.

Preferred Course Placement:

- Every effort will be made to accommodate students in their preferred courses within the restrictions of the timetable.
- Students are sorted by software, so the timing of request placement does not impact the outcome.

Option Change Requests:

• If mistakes are made during option selection, students may request an option change in the fall. Forms for such requests will be available in the school office.

Option Fees:

• Fees are charged per course and vary by grade and subject. Fees will be added to SchoolZone in the fall and can be paid online.

A Quick Guide to Selecting a Second Language:

Beginner French:

- Ideal for students new to French or those who need to strengthen their foundational knowledge.
- Covers basic expressions, questions, alphabet, numbers, months, days, beginner vocabulary, and simple sounds.
- The language of instruction is partially in French with English support. All students are encouraged to engage in listening, reading, speaking, and writing French.

Advanced French:

- Suitable for students with prior experience in French who are comfortable with basic language elements.
- Focuses on building upon foundational knowledge, polishing language skills, and enhancing language proficiency.
- The language of instruction is mostly in French.

Chinese Language and Culture:

- Intended for students interested in learning a new language and exploring Chinese culture.
- Develop communication skills in spoken and written Chinese.
- Utilizes various teaching methods such as music, role-playing, audio/visual materials, pair and group work to enhance language learning and interest in Chinese culture.

Here's a detailed overview of the option courses available at Ottewell School:

Art (Full Year Option):

 Students engage in a multi-phase creative process, exploring various arts activities and projects including sketching, drawing, sculpture (wire, wood, plasticine), and other media to create artworks.

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Band (Full Year Option):

 This program offers students the chance to learn a woodwind, brass, or percussion instrument, regardless of prior musical experience. The school band performs at concerts, festivals, and presentations.

Computer Applications:

• Students delve into modern technologies such as 3D printing, coding, and robotics to foster curiosity and creativity.

Construction:

• An introduction to construction fabrication processes through hands-on project work. Students learn tool and machine safety, project planning, construction finishing, and shop safety.

Drama:

 Students explore theatrical games, concentration exercises, mime, vocal exercises, speeches, monologues, video broadcast techniques, creativity, and improvisation.

Environmental Outdoor Education:

 An opportunity for students to engage in outdoor activities such as shelter building, archery, skiing, fishing, and camping, while learning about the environment.

Film Studies:

• Students analyze movies across various genres, complete related projects and questions, review professional movie reviews, and discuss key elements of film.

Food Studies:

• Students work in teams to interpret recipes and prepare dishes from around the world, participating in food challenges like muffin makeover and casserole creation.

Forensic Science:

• Students examine crime scenes, analyzing handwriting, hair samples, fibers, blood typing, and fingerprint samples.

Leadership:

• Students develop leadership skills, teamwork, creativity, communication, and citizenship by planning events within the school and volunteering in the community.

Photography:

• Students learn digital photography basics, including image composition and editing techniques.

Sport Fit:

• Designed for students interested in physical activity and fitness improvement, offering activities like yoga, rock climbing, Zumba, weightlifting, and kickboxing.

These diverse options provide students with opportunities to explore their interests and develop new skills throughout the school year.

4) OSCR will bring you to a start page with your available English Language Arts classes



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


- Full-year options (BAND and ART) have a unit value of 3 because they last all year and are in FINE ARTS.
